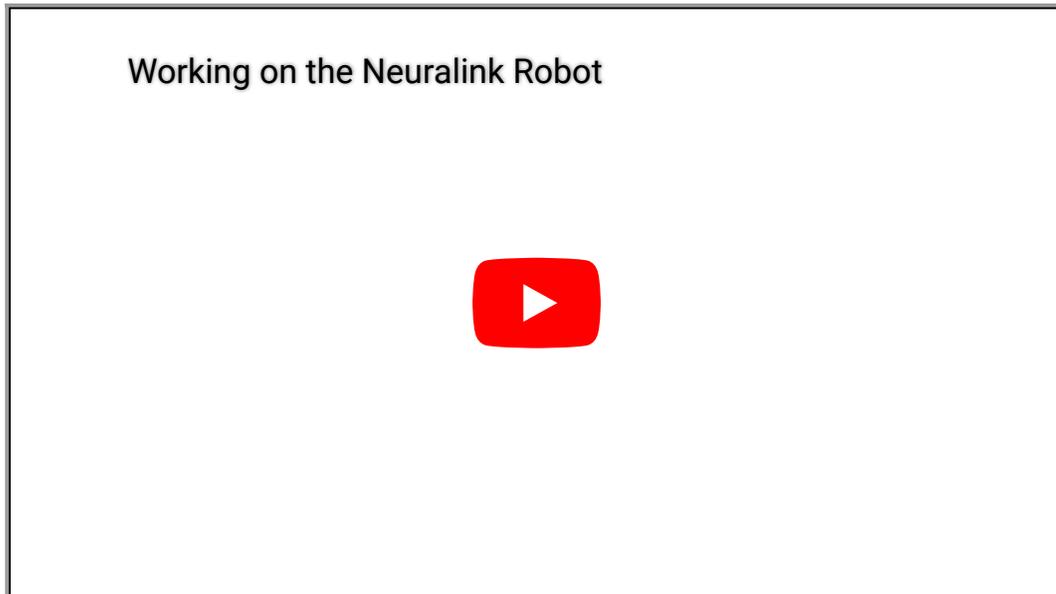
Company Description:

We are a federal contractor or subcontractor. The law requires us to provide equal employment opportunity to qualified people with disabilities.
